

TUBERCULOSIS TESTING

The County Board of Education recognizes that tuberculosis poses a public health threat. Treatment of active cases of this disease is the most effective means of controlling its spread.

The Superintendent or designee will report to the Public Health Department when qualified medical personnel reasonably suspect that a student has or had active tuberculosis. The Superintendent or designee will follow Health Department direction in regards to student and employee exposure to tuberculosis.

Students known to have had a positive tuberculosis skin test shall be excluded from school until they provide evidence of a follow-up x-ray and appropriate medical care or are no longer suspected of having active tuberculosis.

All County Office staff may be given information on how tuberculosis is spread and how it can be prevented and treated.
