CONCEPTS AND ROLES

The County Board of Education affirms the important role of the County Office of Education in curriculum development and instructional improvement. Under the direction of the County Superintendent of Schools, the County Office of Education provides instructional programs and services for students in various programs including special education, juvenile court, regional occupation and community schools.

The County Superintendent, with County Board approval when required by law, may also provide coordination and direct services for school districts, such as providing and preparing courses of study, staff development, instructional materials and equipment, information services and other services that provide for the overall improvement of school district educational programs.

The County Superintendent, with County Board approval, may also provide audiovisual equipment and services to nonpublic institutions and schools. (Education Code 1251)
